Dear Chancellor Thorp:



Dear Professor Dobelstein:

I write in connection with the UNC Retired Faculty Association's (RFA) request for recognition by the University. Please understand that UNC values the unique role and status of our retired faculty members and honors their continued contributions to the multiple missions of the University.

Towards the goal of enhancing our connection to the retired faculty, I concur with the recommendation from the Executive Associate Provost that the activities of RFA be housed within the UNC Office of Faculty Governance. In particular, RFA may use the Office of Faculty Governance's campus mailing address. The Secretary of the Faculty will coordinate RFA's use of the mailing address and will seek reimbursement from RFA of any costs associated with RFA's mailings.

This arrangement does not make RFA a University recognized organization. Other than the Associated Entity process to which our fundraising foundations must adhere and the recognition process for student groups, there is no "recognition process" for other groups. This arrangement also does not make RFA a University administrative unit; rather it respects RFA's autonomy and independence while celebrating its importance to our campus.
